## 01 Introduction To VFAHT

Volunteer Force Against Hepatitis Transmission (VFAHT) is a volunteer body of students and faculty members from the fields of medicine, dentistry, allied health, biomedical sciences, and other university programs working for the prevention and control of Hepatitis.

Today, VFAHT has 5 major domains that cover almost 10 infectious diseases includes Hepatitis B & C, HIV, Tuberculosis, Hepatitis A & E, Malaria and Dengue and Research being the latest addition.

VFAHT is growing rapidly with the ambition to serve the nation. It now has 25 Local Councils across Pakistan and more than 2500 Volunteers. VFAHT has organized more than 200 campus and community activities under its banner so far.

VFAHT Was founded on August 6, 2016 at CM secretariat Punjab. Our parent organization IPAC foundation is registered both in Pakistan & USA.

Keeping in view that the early diagnosis leads to better prognosis. This Campaing was started under the Supervision of our Staff Incharge Dr Tayyab.



## O6 Screening Workshop

A workshop was conducted at New Teaching Block, RMU on 23rd May 2022 where volunteers were briefed about the usage of Hepatitis B and C screening kits. The purpose of this workshop to make the students able to perform hepatitis screening with all the precautionary measures.

This workshop was arranged prior to the "Hepatitis Free Zone " Campaign Initiated by the Worthy VC.





## O 7 Screening Camp NTB

Hepatitis B and C screening camp was arranged in New Teaching Block Rawalpindi Medical University by VFAHT (Volunteer Force Against Hepatitis Transmission) on 24 May 2022. Up to 270 students were screened, all of whom turned negative. This was the first camp of Phase 1 of RMU Hepatitis Free Zone project. The camp was conducted under the supervision of

"Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Muhammad Umar (TI)" and the guidance of Dr. Tayyab Saeed, Dr Omaima Asif & Dr Asif. Rawalpindi Medical University is considered one of the leading institutes in the country in extending awareness of spread, treatment and prevention of hepatitis among mass communities and locals.

Total No. Of Students Screened were 270.

## OS Screening Camp OTB

VFAHT RMU conducted the second Hepatitis B & C screening camp in Phase-1 of RMU Hepatitis Free Zone Project at the Old Teaching Block, Rawalpindi Medical University on

28th May 2022.

Approximately 200 students from first and second year MBBS were screened along with 15 staff members via Rapid Testing Kits, all of whom were found to be negative. Along with screening, awareness was also provided on the gravity of the diseases that Hepatitis B & C are, and the diagnostic and treatment options available along with preventive measures that can be taken in order to protect ourselves from these diseases.

This was the second camp of phase 1 of RMU Hepatitis Free Zone Project.
