# LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

In March this year, institutional educational activities were closed with immediate effect as per the directive of government in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Uninterrupted academics were ensured by the digitalization of medical education at Rawalpindi Medical University (RMU) with immediate effect through E-learning. This learning management system was inaugurated at RMU on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2020. It is comprised of two phases:

- $\Rightarrow$  Phase-I: *Short-term* virtual education solution to tackle the current situation.
- ⇒ Phase-II: *Long term* plan to digitalize education processes at DME to assist management, teachers and students.

LMS was initiated for MBBS, Allied Health Sciences and Postgraduate certificate courses at RMU and its smooth execution:

- $\Rightarrow$  Login and passwords have been given to all MBBS classes.
- $\Rightarrow$  All lectures available on the website have been uploaded on LMS.
- $\Rightarrow$  Students are successfully accessing uploaded learning resource materials.
- $\Rightarrow$  The attendance system is in place.
- $\Rightarrow$  Assignments can be uploaded.
- $\Rightarrow$  Notification Board is ready.

Orientation sessions of University faculty were also conducted for audio recording and uploading of lectures.

As per Instructions of HEC, *Student Survey Proforma* was also uploaded to gather information from students pertinent to the availability of internet, connectivity issues, and quality of online education.

Online sessions via Zoom were carried out with 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>-year MBBS students by Prof. Rai Muhammad Asghar to identify the problems faced by medical students in online learning. Meeting ID and password were conveyed to all. Moreover, probable solutions to academic problems were also discussed with the students for their facilitation and convenience.





The MCQs based online assessments of the students are also carried out to streamline their leaning process. There is also a plan to commence online clinical teaching of the medical students in their respective clinical batches soon.

# FACULTY RESEARCH FORUM

## RMU— COVID 19

Rawalpindi Medical University and its Allied Hospitals have been at the forefront of COVID-19 management long before the disease made its way to Pakistan. Preparations were made. including the establishment of a fully equipped dedicated COVID-19 management



hospital, in the guise of Rawalpindi Institute of Urology. RIU and Benazir Bhutto Hospital were declared Corona Hospitals and they have since catered to a vast bulk of patients alone. Currently, Patients are being looked after in 4 major hospitals and 2 field hospitals, namely Rawalpindi Institute of Urology, Benazir Bhutto Hospital, Holy Family Hospital, District Headquarters Hospital and Sports Complex and Red Crescent Field Hospitals. RIU, SCFH and RCH were dedicated facilities for diagnosed cases only. A total of 860 beds have been utilized at these facilities for COVID-19 care, out of which there are 75 isolation rooms, 213 beds in isolation wards, 263 beds with a central oxygen supply and 69 ventilator beds. The beds capacity and oxygen beds capacity had to be increased exponentially to deal with the patient load. RMU and Allied Hospitals received a more than 21000 patients in the flu filter clinics, suspected more than 2,500 individuals out of 1841 were positive. A total of 956 have been discharged and 252 have died. An brief overview of the pandemic at RMU follows.

Since the 16th of March, RMU and Allied Hospitals have been operating Flu Filter Clinics at Benazir Bhutto Hospital, Holy Family Hospital and District Headquarters Hospital. Since establishing these clinics, more than 26,000 individuals have been

screened, with Benazir Bhutto Hospital catering to more than 20,000 patients alone. HFH and DHQ played more of a supporting role, with HFH screening more than 4,000 individuals and DHQ, more than 2,000. The trend of individuals reporting to the flu filter clinics has remained fairly stable with a weekly average of more than 2,000.



Since starting the Flu Filter Clinics, 3535 individuals were declared suspected cases at a ratio of 1:13, with 1 in every 13 being suspected. Once again BBH admitted

the most suspected cases, at more than 800, followed by HFH and DHQ. Initially, during the first 9 weeks, the ratio of suspected cases against screen patients was fairly low, at 1:18, however during the next 4 weeks, the ratio skyrocketed to 1:4.



confirmed was a relatively gentle slope, however in the last month, that slope virtually became a cliff. At Benazir Bhutto Hospital and District Headquarters Hospital, nearly 30% of all patients tested positive, whereas nearly 50% of screened patients tested positive. RMU received its first 500 patients in 48 days, next 500 in 21 days and third 500 in 9 days.

Currently 366 patients are admitted in the facilities, out of which 229 are on oxygen, 18 are on ventilatory support and the remainder are currently stable. The number of patients on oxygen has exploded since the start of June, with more patients on oxygen and ventilatory sup-



port as compared to stable patients. This is partially due to the home isolation policy, in which patients with mild to moderate symptoms are permitted to isolate themselves in their homes under strict monitoring and follow up from the hospital.



Currently 356 positive patients have been isolated at home, whereas 236 of the admitted patients are positive and 108 are awaited.

Since the starting of the epidemic, nearly 1000 patients have recovered and been discharged. These patients test negative 2 consecutive times, 10 days after being diagnosed. This ac-



counts for 40% of all cases and 79% of closed cases.

Rawalpindi Medical University has a mortality rate of 13.6% amongst all reported cases and 21% amongst closed cases. The death rate climbed in proportion to the rise in the number of confirmed cases and critical cases. Analysis of these deaths showed that the mean age was 54.4 years and there was a 2:1 ratio between males and female. Analysis

also revealed that 75% of these patients had comorbids, with more than 2/3rd having more than a single comorbid. Hypertension and diabetes or a combination of the two were found to be the most common comorbid, followed by heart disease and lung disease.



Hopefully we're nearing the peak of the epidemic and there's still a lot to learn and a long way to go. Learning is taking place on a day to basis and a very practical and dynamic approach has been taken to combat the
