




- ☐ maintaining of record properly both at school & of home visits.
- lacksquare to attend monthly conferences

MEDICAL INSPECTION OF SCHOOL CHILDREN

- ☐ Intimation to parents
- ☐ Initially by nurse then detailed medical examination by SMO
- ☐ Inspection of environment (sp. food)
- ☐ Maintenance of record and necessary action

- ☐ Prevention of spread of communicable diseases

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
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TERTIARY PREVENTION

 - arrangements for such children for their special needs

Core subject

☐ Detailed history and examination: blood tests

☐ Assessment for nutritional deficiencies, vision hearing and speech assessment:

☐ Measurement of weight , height annual testing of vision : maintenance of proper record

☐ School personnel staff

☐ Daily morning inspection

☐ Periodic medical examination

SITTING ARRANGEMENTS

MINUS DESK vertical line from edge of desk falls on the seat
ZERO DESK vertical line from edge of desk touches edge of seat
PLUS DESK vertical line from edge of desk falls outside edge of chair

- ☐ Examine The Effects Of School-based Health Center (SBHC)
 Use On Academic Outcomes For High School Students
- ☐ Significant Increase In Attendance For SBHC Medical Users Compared To Nonusers
- ☐ Grade Point Average Increases Over Time Were Observed For Mental Health Users Compared To Nonusers.
- ☐ Discipline Incidents Were Not Found To Be Associated With Sbhc Use.
